The Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. attended dances at the Simsbury Grange in the 1940's! Grange Halls were often used for dances as well as other social and community events like potlucks, barbeques, holiday parties, and more.

We just learned of this amazing history of our local Grange in late 2019. The Simsbury Grange is trying to find out more about the dances and any other events that Martin Luther King Jr. attended at our Grange. We do know that a few years before Martin Luther King attended a dance our Grange applied for and received a federal tax exemption on dance tickets. In keeping with our history, the Grange plans to once again offer dances that are "Tax Exempt!"
